



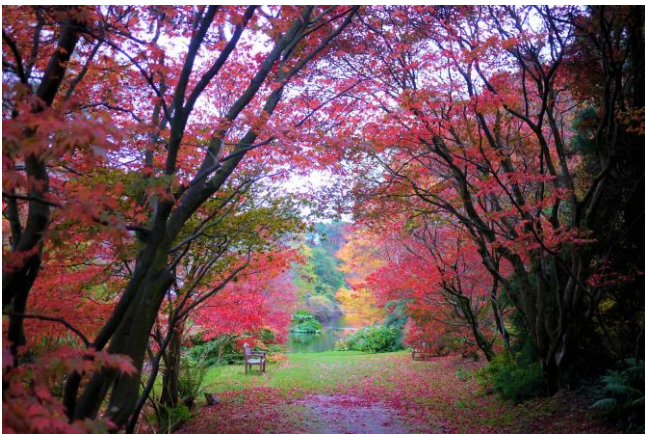
## CONGREGATION OF CHRISTIAN BROTHERS EUROPEAN PROVINCE

### Projects

*Work is progressing well on the various projects mentioned in previous newsletters. Some examples of work in hand are:*

#### Rationalisation:

*Liam has taken charge of rationalisation. A list of criteria has been drawn up as a guideline in trying to decide on closures. During our three days of facilitation with Bridget Ehlert at the end of this month, we intend to discuss this issue in detail and make some decisions.*



#### Visitation:

*Paul has drawn up a project plan for visitation and has made out a rota. We hope to carry out visitation between mid-January and the end of April. In the meantime, if any community has matters that they would like to be addressed during visitation please let us know.*

### Emmaus:

Chris is in dialogue with a number of brothers with regard to the community in Emmaus.

### Vocation Awareness:

Dominic has put together a small group of brothers to come up with a plan for the way forward in promoting vocation awareness.

### Legal Fees:

Edmund, together with our legal advisors and staff from L&P, is pursuing the issue of the refund of legal fees which the province incurred during the Ryan Commission.

### Edmund Rice Network

On Wednesday, 5<sup>th</sup> November, the PLT met with the leadership group from ERN. Wilf Hammond facilitated what was a very lively, encouraging meeting. Among the topics discussed were:

Membership of the ERN and intentionality;  
The possibility of having a co-ordinator;  
The role of an animator.

The PLT hopes to make some decisions regarding the ERN after further consultation.

### Meeting of Community Leaders

A meeting of community leaders took place on Saturday, 8<sup>th</sup> of November in MIE. There were 35 community leaders in attendance. The morning was given over to reflection and discussion on the calls of the Nairobi Chapter

and how they might be implemented in community.

The after lunch agenda included topics such as:

- Rationalisation
- PSP
- Inputs from Owen McCabe (L&P), Derek O'Neill (L&P and Province Finance Office); Ruth Rooney (Services Manager) and Brenda Farrell (Health Care).

### Engagements

Dominic and Paul visited the Life Centre in Cherry Orchard. They were very impressed with the lovely spirit in the Centre and the excellent work that is being done there.

Having visited the centre, the need for such provision is obvious; it is difficult to understand government intransigence when it comes to the question of funding.



Liam and Paul attended a function in Synge Street Secondary School where eighty-one past students of the school, who are currently attending third level, were presented with bursaries ranging in value from €300 to €500. These bursaries are made possible by a generous bequest from Con Creedon, a past pupil of the school.

The presentations took place after the Synge Street PPU annual November Mass for deceased past pupils and former teachers of the school. Both Tom Earley and Eddie McEvoy were fondly remembered.

*Paul spent some time with the communities in St Timothy's (Liverpool) and in Woodeaves and Salford.*

*Members of the PLT attended the launch of the Annual report of The Lantern Centre on Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> November. More than 50 groups make use of the centre on a regular basis in a living out of the chapter call 'To work collaboratively within the Church and with others, valuing cultural and religious diversity and interconnectedness'.*



*Edmund attended the launch by An Taoiseach, Mr Enda Kenny T.D. of the sesquicentenary (150 years to you and me) celebrations of Westland Row C.B.S.*

*On behalf of the Trustees in England, which still govern eight ER schools, Dominic visited the 4 Preparatory schools in Liverpool, Birkenhead, Stoke-on-Trent and Hale Barns. This is an annual meeting between the Trustees, the Governors and senior management. All four schools are flourishing at present.*

*Dominic attended the AGM of the Vocation Office in the UK and also that of Vocation Ireland. He was able to make good contacts with others in vocation work and to see what resources are available*

*The Province Vocation Awareness group had its first meeting on Sunday 23rd November at the Province Centre. They met to brainstorm*

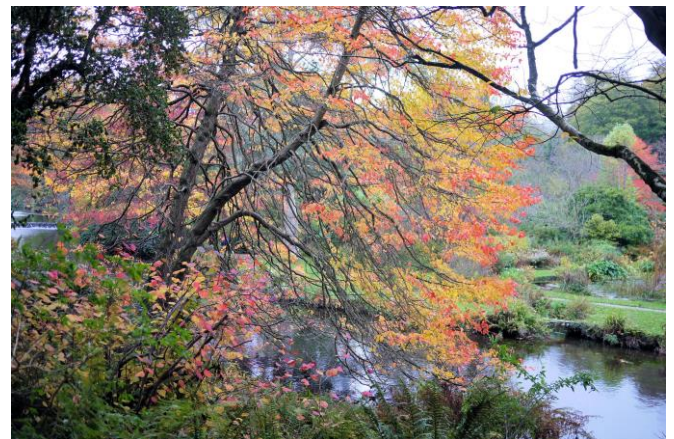
### **ERN Meeting in Emmaus**
