


May this Lenten season serve as a source of strength, inspiration, and growth for you, dear leaders.

The Synod on Synodality

The first session of the Synod was held in October 2023 and the second session is to be held in October 2024. In several issues of this **Consortium Chronicle** before the Synod and after it we have provided information. As we did in the past we would like to provide information in preparation for the second session in October of this year.

- 1 RECAP
- Synod means WALKING TOGETHER
- Prep Sessions were held on the parish, diocese and national levels
- There were 365 voting members (Bishops, Priests, Religious, Women, Men)
- The Report at the end of the first session:

>a Synodal Church is a Church in Mission

>asked for research on how to give women more access to Church Positions

>find ways to hear and accompany people who feel marginalized by the Church:because of their marriage, identity or sexuality

:the LGBTQ+ shorthand was not used in the document due to resistance from the Church in Africa (thus the references to sexual identity instead)

:reference is made to people who are alienated because they may have an irregular marriage (more than one)

Since the SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

1. There has been much backtalk about the Final Document and the Synod itself as seen in Comments made by the retired Cardinal of Hong Kong, Joseph Zen:

"On the one hand, the Church is presented as founded by Jesus on the apostles and their successors, with a hierarchy of ordained ministers who guide the faithful on the journey toward the heavenly Jerusalem.

"On the other hand, there is talk of an undefined Synodality, a 'democracy of the baptized'. Which baptized people? Do they at least go to Church regularly?"

2. We have had the Decree that says same sex couples may receive a blessing.

>The Bishops of the Church in Africa petitioned and received permission not to comply with the Decree.

GOING FORWARD

A Synod (walking together) has a long history and tradition in the Church. It has been a constant in the life of the Eastern Church but was lost to the Western Church for centuries until Vatican Council II (1962-1965). Vatican II restored the Synod (it has met every 3 years since) as a way to implement its vision, directions and hopes for the future.

[One thing critics of Pope Francis keep saying is: **the Synod is <u>NOT</u> Vatican III.**But it is Francis implementing the vision of Church presented to us by the Bishops assembled at the Vatican Council (1962-1965).]

Going forward in Preparation for the second session in October of the SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: We will present a summary of some of the major contributions that Vatican II made to what it means to be **Catholic in Our Time and Place** by looking at a few of the Documents (Vatican documents are always known by their first words:

Lumen Gentium [The Church]
Gaudium et Spes [The Church in the Modern World]
Apostolicam Actuositatem[The Role of Laity]
Gravissimum Educatonis[On Christian Education]

SOCIETY

 Home Schooling's rise from fringe to fastest growing form of education (Washington Post:December 4,2023)

Public Education down 4% since 2017-2018. Private Education up 7% since 2017.2018. Home Schooling up 59% since 2017-2018

- 2. U.S. District Judge Kent Wetherell issued a ruling against the Escambia (FL) County School Board, which has banned above 1,500 books, including the dictionary, under H.B.1069. The judge ruled that book removals violated the First Amendment and rejected the (FL) state's argument.
- 3. Vaping declines among high school students. (The Boston Globe: 11/3/2023)
 The number of high school students who reported using e-cigarettes fell to 10% last spring compared to 14% in Spring 2022.

Vaping **rose** slightly among **middle school** students to 4.6% from 3.3%

90% of the students who reported vaping said they used flavored products.
